Introduction

Knockout Roses look good any time of the year. Many areas enjoy blooms up to 9 months a year. Winter foliage starts as a dark burgundy then lightens up to orange-red. Grows to a tight, compact 3-4 foot high shrub/hedge. A highly versatile plant that works where ever you put it.

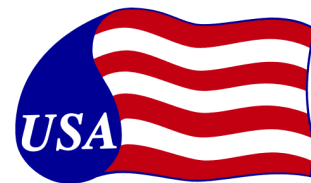
Since the plant will continue to bloom throughout the growing season, there is no need to trim off old or dead flowers. New flowers are continually pushing the old ones out of the way.

Naturally resistant to diseases and pests that attack other roses, such as: mildew, fungi, black pot, Japanese beetle, rose midge and leafhoppers.

Long periods of rain, drought, extreme heat or extreme cold no longer matter. Knockout Roses thrive from Florida to Canada, in full sun or partial shade. Plant where you need low shrubs, annuals, or perennials.

Knockout Rose Continued

Planting

- Available in 1, 3 or 5 gal containers.
- Suggested plant spacing are: Plant 18", 24" to 36" OC
- Bed Preparation:
 - Spread 3" of bed mix in ground cover beds
 - Till 6" deep, rake beds to drain away from structure
 - Plant
 - Topdress with 2" of double ground (fine) hardwood mulch.
- Hand water in after planting
- Set sprinkler controller to water beds:
 - Once every two days for two weeks in spring and early fall.
 - Once a day for two weeks when temperatures reach 98+ degrees.
 - Have Owner monitor moisture and report over or under watering immediately.
 - After two weeks reassess the watering needs, and set at twice a week thereafter.
