Introduction

Crape Myrtles are small, multi-branched shrubs to small trees known for their ornamental flowers, bark and foliage. The large showy clusters of flowers range from white to pink to red to purple. The upright-arching trunks have gray to brown bark, which peels away to reveal the smooth pale-pink bark. Plant this tree against a light-colored wall for best effect.

Planting

- Typically planted in 10, 15, 30, 45, 65, or 95 gal containers.
- B&B trees are specified in height (6' – 8' ht, etc)
- Container trees can be double the price of B&B trees
- Plant container trees in late summer, if price allows
- Plant B&B trees if they were dug and cured in the winter months
